

**RESOLUTION NO. 2004**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TERRELL, TEXAS, APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF AN APPLICATION AND THE ACCEPTANCE OF AN AWARD FROM THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE, OFFICE OF JUSTICE PROGRAMS, PATRICK LEAHY BULLETPROOF VEST PARTNERSHIP GRANT.**

**WHEREAS**, the Terrell City Council finds it in the best interest of the citizens of the City of Terrell that the Terrell Police Department use Bulletproof Partnership Grant funds to purchase Bulletproof Vests for the Terrell Police Department; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Terrell will not use these funds for any of the specifically prohibited uses; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Terrell is eligible to participate in this program as a unit of local government; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Terrell is eligible for a reimbursement award amount up to \$11,936.00; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Terrell will utilize funds for purchases from vendors within the United States of America in an effort to help stimulate our national economy; and

**WHEREAS**, the Terrell City Council agrees that in the event of loss or misuse of US Department of Justice funds, the Terrell City Council assures that the funds will be returned to the US Department of Justice in full; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Terrell is not required to provide a local match; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Terrell will forward the proposed application to the United States Department of Justice; and

**WHEREAS**, the Terrell City Council designates Ken McKeown, Chief of Police, as the City's authorized official. The authorized official is given the power to apply for, accept, reject, alter or terminate the grant on behalf of the applicant agency.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TERRELL, TEXAS** as follows:

**SECTION 1.** That an application is hereby authorized to be filed on behalf of the City of Terrell with the United States Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, for the Patrick Leahy Bulletproof Vest Partnership Grant for the purchase of bulletproof vests for the Terrell Police Department.

**SECTION 2.** That the application is for a reimbursement award amount not to exceed \$11,936.00 with no City match.

**SECTION 3.** That if the United States Department of Justice Bulletproof Partnership Grant is awarded to the City, the City will accept it.
